A. Facility Specific Conditions:

B. Record Keeping Conditions:

1. The permit holder shall keep a log of hours of operation, fuel used, purchase orders, invoices, and other documents as necessary to support the information to be submitted.
2. The permit holder shall keep records of the amount of VOC waste materials generated and method of disposal in accordance with the requirements of District Rule 234. These records shall including the amount of solvent disposed of as waste, the amount of solvent sent to resource recovery, or the amount of solvent sent to a treatment facility.
3. The permit holder shall keep current copies of the Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for each spray coated material used on-site.
4. The permit holder shall keep daily records of VOC containing materials used to verify that the emissions from the spray painting operations do not exceed the daily VOC limit in this permit. These records shall include a daily log of the type and quantity of each type of coating product, as applied, and/or a monthly log of hours of operation, purchase orders, invoices, or other documents as necessary to support the information recorded. Daily records shall be made available at the request of the APCO or the APCO's representative.
5. The permit holder shall maintain a copy of each applicable CARB approved Executive Order and each applicable CARB approved Installation, Operation, and Maintenance Manual at the facility and shall make the documents available for review by the APCO or the APCO's representative.
6. The permit holder shall log weekly inspections on a District-approved Weekly Vapor Recovery Equipment Inspection Form.
7. The permit holder shall record each individual In-Station Diagnostic (ISD) alarm and associated repair on a District approved ISD reporting form and shall make the documents available for review by the APCO or the APCO's representative.
8. To demonstrate compliance with NESHAPs Subpart HHHHHH, the permit holder shall maintain a copy of the approval of the Petition for Exemption onsite and make the record available at the request of the APCO or his or her representative.
9. The permit holder shall keep daily records of VOC containing materials used to verify that the emissions from the spray painting operations do not exceed the daily VOC limit in this permit. These records shall include a daily log of the type and quantity of each type of coating product, as applied, the mix ratio of components used, VOC content of the coating as applied or solvent as used, note if color match was required, and type of vehicle or mobile equipment coated.
10. The permit holder shall keep the records of maintenance (oil, air cleaner, hoses and belts) required by the engine manufacturer's or permit holder's operation and maintenance plan and an accordance with the frequencies in this permit.
11. The permit holder shall keep records of type, quantity, and VOC content for all coatings exceeding the VOC limits of Rule 241 to demonstrate compliance with the 55-gallon non-compliant coatings per year exemption threshold.

C. Record Submittal Conditions:

The following information shall be submitted to the District before January 31st of the following year:

1. The type of product, manufacturer, product code, total gallons used per year (gal/yr), and the total pounds of VOC per gallon (lb/gal) or VOC percent by weight (%/wt.) for each spray coating, reducer, solvent or other VOC containing product used.
2. Total hours of operation per year for maintenance and testing purposes (hrs/yr).
3. Total hours of operation per year for emergency purposes (hrs/yr).
4. Type and total annual quantity of fuel used (MMscf/yr, therms/yr or gal/yr).
5. End of year hours meter reading.

California Code, Health and Safety Code - HSC § 42451

(a) On its own motion, or upon the motion of the district board or the air pollution control officer, the hearing board may, after notice and a hearing, issue an order for abatement whenever it finds that any person is constructing or operating any article, machine, equipment, or other contrivance without a permit required by this part, or is in violation of Section 41700 or 41701 or of any order, rule, or regulation prohibiting or limiting the discharge of air contaminants into the air.

(b) As an alternative to subdivision (a), the hearing board may issue an order for abatement pursuant to the stipulation of the air pollution control officer and the person or persons accused of constructing or operating any article, machine, equipment, or other contrivance without a permit required by this part, or of violating Section 41700 or 41701, or any order, rule, or regulation prohibiting or limiting the discharge of air contaminants into the air, upon the terms and conditions set forth in the stipulation, without making the finding required under subdivision (a). The hearing board shall, however, include a written explanation of its action in the order for abatement.
